WILLARD

You know, my mama says when a girl looks at you like I seen Ariel lookin', she is on to you like a hog on slop. But if Chuck sees you flirting with Ariel, you are a dead man.

ARIEL

Daddy, lately all you do is look for the worst in people and then, of course, you find it. Today's sermon is: the world is evil, and Ariel has to be locked away in a tower. Daddy, you make me feel like a prisoner. And I hate it! I just hate it!

ETHEL

Ren, I don't want to move any more than you do. I, too, wish your father hadn't left and we both wish I could be one of those strong single mothers who suddenly becomes self-sufficient! But I'm not. [pause] Please feel free to disagree.

VI

The accident changed everything. Ever since Bobby's death, you make impossible demands on Ariel. Shaw, when you give a sermon you can lift a congregation up so high, they have to look down to see heaven. It's the one-on-one where you need a little work.

RUSTY

Great sermon, Reverend! And oh! What you said about Walt Whitman and rock 'n' roll and "listen to the music in your soul," and all that, I mean, I was, like, "Who knew?"
